Danielle will be introducing talk for writing jotters for the children to create their own stories and providing lots of different resources for mark making.



We signed up for The Ruby Robin Award, which is a free, fun challenge for children. It gives children the opportunity to learn about the birds they see and to encourage them to take positive action for nature and help them over the winter!



We had to complete 1 activity from 4 types of challenges which we did and received our Ruby Robin Award. The children made Mosaic Bird Feeders which we hung up in our garden. We identified the birds that came to our garden using binoculars and books to identify them. We studied fact sheets to learn more about them and listened to birdsong to hear their singing voices. We also made an outdoor display wall to track our journey and revisit our learning.

In the home corner the children have been exploring various sensory materials when making play dough, exploring the rice, pasta and shaving foam incorporating this into role play when making food in the kitchen. They have shown great independence skills when pouring and mixing ingredients using various utensils. They have also shown great imaginative play getting very creative with various cakes and treats they make with each other which has expanded their social and language skills.

The children have shown an interest in the story book "Mr wolf's pancakes" and after some discussion the children have come up with various activities that they wanted to do within the home corner and shown great ideas to turn the home corner into Mr wolf's house. Amy

Within the literacy area, we will be concentrating on Mr. Wolf's Pancakes for our next talk for writing focus. In addition to creating various scenarios and stories using the characters from the books, the children will be able to mark, create, listen to, and recall stories. With opportunities for imaginative play, writing, counting, and number recognition, we will have fun reenacting the story.
